July 26 through August 4, 2010

Join the Friends of the Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania and experience breathtaking mountain scenery, and great train rides!

Day 1. Harrisburg—Calgary. Travel via motorcoach from the Harrisburg area to Philadelphia for your flight to Calgary. This evening, mix and mingle with your traveling companions as your tour director prepares you for your upcoming Canadian Rockies adventure. Your hotel tonight is the Westin Calgary.

Day 2. Calgary—Lake Louise. This morning, enjoy a tour of Calgary before heading to Canada Olympic Park, where you will be

treated to a private breakfast and presentation by an Olympic athlete about training and participating in the Olympic games. Next, continue on to Lake Louise, where the remainder of the day is at leisure. Your hotel tonight is the famous Fairmont Chateau Lake Louise. (Breakfast & Dinner Included)

Day 3. Lake Louise—Icefields Parkway—Jasper. Journey north on Icefields Parkway and savor stunning vistas of alpine meadows, waterfalls and glacier masses. You'll stop at Peyto Lake, which many consider to be one of the best in the world. Next, you'll enjoy a memorable ride on an ice explorer at the Columbia Icefield. Continue on to Jasper National Park, where your hotel for the next two nights is Fairmont Jasper Park Lodge. (Breakfast & Dinner Included)

Day 4. Jasper. This morning, enjoy an excursion to Maligne Lake and a fully narrated cruise to Spirit Island. After your cruise, select how you wish to spend your afternoon: either a leisurely float trip on the Athabasca River or a guided nature walk to learn more about the area's flora and fauna. (Breakfast Included)

Day 5. Jasper—Banff. This morning, you'll stop at thundering Athabasca Falls before continuing on to Banff and Yoho National Park. Arrive in Banff with the balance of the day at leisure. Your hotel for the next two nights is the Fairmont Banff Springs Hotel. (Breakfast Included)

Day 6. Banff. Enjoy sightseeing with a ride on the Banff gondola up Sulphur Mountain. Afterward, a scenic drive around Tunnel Mountain brings new surprises, from wildlife to unique landscapes. This afternoon is at leisure and your tour director hosts a special dinner this evening. (Breakfast & Dinner Included)

Day 7. Banff—Rocky Mountaineer—Kamloops. This morning, board the Rocky Mountaineer and travel over the Continental Divide and along the Kicking Horse River. You'll travel eastward to Shushwap Lake with its thousand miles of shore line and then spend the night in Kamloops. Tonight, enjoy the optional Maple Leaf musical dinner show. Your hotel information is not yet available. (Breakfast & Lunch Included)

Day 8. Kamloops—Rocky Mountaineer—Vancouver. Back aboard the Rocky Mountaineer, enjoy your amazing journey through the fertile fields of the Thompson Valley and the beautiful Fraser Canyon. Late this afternoon, arrive in Vancouver, where you'll be transferred to your hotel, the Fairmont Waterfront, for a two-night stay. (Breakfast & Lunch Included)

Day 9. Vancouver. You have a full day to explore this vibrant city. Why not join an optional excursion to Vancouver Island and the charming seaside city of Victoria, or explore Gastown or Granville Island. (Breakfast Included)

CANCELLATION PENALTIES: Deposit date to day of departure \$25 per person

From May 20, 2010 to day of departure: airfare is NON-REFUNDABLE.

From June 11 to July 4, 2010: 20% of total fare per person, plus any additional suppliers fees.
