

Safety First!

As the Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania reopens to the public, operations have been adjusted to provide a safer environment for all staff, volunteers, and visitors.

As of June 28, 2021, the following guidelines and recommendations will apply:

Face Masks

Although they are no longer required, face masks are still encouraged while at our museum for all staff, volunteers, and visitors.

Social Distancing

Wherever possible, social distancing (a minimum of six feet apart) is still recommended for all staff, volunteers, and visitors.

Limiting Capacity

To promote social distancing, we will continue to uphold many of our capacity limits throughout our museum, wherever possible.

Hand Hygiene

Visitors should wash their hands or use hand sanitizer frequently during their visit. Hand sanitizer is available throughout the museum.

If You Have Symptoms

Anyone experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 (including fever, cough, chills, sore throat, fatigue, shortness of breath, or loss of taste) should refrain from visiting until they are symptom-free. We will welcome you back at that time.

Cleaning and Disinfecting

Restrooms and other “high touch” surfaces, including door handles, push plates, railings, switches, countertops, and benches will be cleaned periodically during the day.

Additional Information

Some of the trains we traditionally “open” for browsing, as well as some of our high-touch interactives, may remain temporarily unavailable, as these spaces are difficult to keep clean and sanitized during periods of heavy visitation.
